A workshop to discuss the Church's voice in addressing gun violence in America

You're invited to participate in a workshop on Saturday, August 19 to discuss what the Church's role and voice should be in speaking to the prevalence of gun violence in our nation. Churches in Augusta County and Staunton are all invited to send members.

The purpose of this event is to encourage conversations about how Christ's Church can address the epidemic of gun violence that plagues our communities and our nation.

This is not intended to be a partisan or political event. We are not gathering to debate or take positions on the 2nd amendment, gun control, or gun ownership.

The Church is the body of Christ in the world. As Christ's hands, feet, and voice, we not only proclaim the good news of God's redemption, mercy, and love, but we are also called to speak Christ's peace to the world in the face of violence, fear, pain, and death.

This event is intended to encourage local churches to continue to hold conversations about and identify ways that they can be the voice and presence of Christ's peace in the world. What does it look like for God's people to address the epidemic of gun violence in our culture? How can we support law enforcement? What can we do to lessen the possibility of gun violence in our own community? How can we be faithful in ways that bring Christ's grace, healing, and peace in the event of gun violence?

Updates from Session

- Session met on Tuesday, July 11, 2023 with Rev. Binder serving as moderator.
- ♦ A 2023 budget was presented and approved.
- ◆ The Home Goods Community Pantry will continue. Please let the community know about this wonderful resource.
- Session will be having a Fall Retreat.
- ◆ The air conditioning units in the Sanctuary are not working. As we gather bids and get things all fixed up, we will be meeting for worship in the Chapel. Please plan to join us in the chapel until the end of September. If things are resolved sooner, we will let you know.

2023 Budget Approved

The Session approved a budget for 2023 at the stated meeting on July 11, 2023. We have been delayed in this task by several factors. Please join with your session in recognition that 2022 was a difficult year and that 2023 has been a time of regrouping and renewal for First Presbyterian. We restructured the Session, our stewardship time was delayed, and we awaited the leadership of an Interim Pastor.

We wish to share with you our projected income, expenses, and expected deficit as reflected in the 2023 approved budget.

2023 TOTAL PROJECTED INCOME \$203,960

Our pledged offerings are \$115,060. Other income streams are: unpledged income, rental, trust income and other offerings.

2023 TOTAL PROJECTED BUDGETED EXPENSES \$257,171


2023 PROJECTED NET INCOME/ ANNUAL BUDGET DEFICIT (\$53,211)
