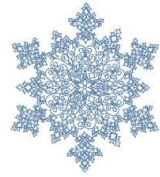

You Are Invited to Share Your Thoughts!

With the month of January and the new year brings a new opportunity for First Presbyterian to begin to envision our next chapter in ministry and mission. But before we start making plans for the future, it's important to know who we are today. Session, in partnership with the Presbytery, has agreed to participate in the *Conversations* on-line survey assessment in order to have a formal process for collecting member feedback regarding the life, interests, and hopes of First Presbyterian. This survey is anonymous, easy to fill out, and hopefully fun! It is very important to get as many of our active church members to provide feedback as possible.



All members and friends are invited to participate with this survey beginning on January 7, 2024! You will be sent an email from the church with a link to fill out the survey on-line. If you would prefer a hard copy survey to be filled out, please let Heidi, Pastor Jeff, or Susie Lendermon know, and we will be sure to get one to you. All surveys need to be completed and turned in by **January 31st**.

Following the survey completion, Session will first meet with a presbytery representative to interpret the initial results. Later in February, we will hold a town hall meal and conversation to go over our results as a church, as we will also discuss possible steps moving forward. Stay tuned!

Below is a brief description of the survey itself:

You Are Invited to Share Your Thoughts!

This benchmarked assessment is designed especially for pastoral transitions and strategic planning in congregations with less than 35 persons in worship either in person or online. Data tells us over and over again, that small congregations can be vital systems doing Christ's work in the community and the world. Taking the time to be intentional about next steps is essential for these congregations.



This assessment instrument that can help you as a leader measure the level of satisfaction and energy in the congregation.

- Discover where members would like to go in the future.
- Get a read on important aspects of your congregation's organizational culture.
- Gauge readiness for change.
- Assess the perceptions of members in key areas of the congregation's ministry.
