Prayer Celebrating History & Tradition

Churches traditionally celebrate Reformation Sunday the last weekend of October. Some churches celebrate figures like Martin Luther or John Calvin. Others wear kilts and present tartans to celebrate our Scottish ancestry as Presbyterians. It's amazing for me to think of the many generations of Christians that have helped to shape the church into what it is today.

Who are you thankful for as part of your faith story?

We often wonder what the church might look like 1, 5, 20, 50, or even 100 years from now. It's my hunch that church might not look anything like we are accustomed to. Yes, back in the 1920s there might have been an organ, and we might have sat in the same pews, but church was quite different! Take it back even further, and I bet the Apostle Paul would be downright speechless (a very hard thing for Paul!) to see how much the Christian Church has changed and evolved since his mission nearly 2,000 years ago.

So this month, let's take a moment to pray being thankful for our ancestors—those who got us to this place and time as First Presbyterian. And perhaps with the next breath, let's be praying for God to open our hearts to what new things might be in store for First Presbyterian and the Christian Church in the days and years ahead.

The church affirms *Ecclesia reformata, semper reformanda secundum verbum Dei*, that is, "The church reformed, always to be reformed according to the Word of God" in the power of the Spirit. (F-2.02, *Book of Order*)

- -In the middle of Churchville, turn left on Route 42 (South).
- About one mile after leaving Churchville and crossing Whisky Creek, take first right turn, Route 725 (Whisky Creek Road).
 Continue on Whisky Creek Road about a mile to the first intersection.
- -At intersection take left hand fork, which is Route 723 and remains Whisky Creek Road. Continue about 1/4 mile passing two white houses and barn on your left directly on road. 300 yards beyond barn is entrance with cattle guard and post with street numbers attached on the right hand side of the gate. Enter and follow farm road to top of hill. Park in field beside house at top of hill.

Guide to 2024 Fall Vaccines: When to Get Your COVID, Flu, and RSV Shots

As the weather cools down and seasonal illnesses start circulating, now is the time to start thinking about vaccines.

THE BASICS

Flu Vaccine

Who should get it: Everyone 6 months and older; people 65 and older should opt for a high-dose vaccine.

COVID Vaccine

Who should get it: Everyone 6 months and older When to get it: ASAP. If you've recently had COVID, you may wait up to three months to get an updated vaccine.

RSV Vaccine

Who should get it: All adults 75 and older; some adults ages 60–74; pregnant people who are 32 through 36 weeks pregnant.

Reflections on Our Home Goods Community Pantry

I was asked to share my experiences with the Home Goods Community Pantry. When I first began volunteering, I didn't know what to expect. I didn't realize that being able to purchase toilet paper, paper towels, tissues, kitchen trash bags, dish soap, laundry detergent, and disinfectant wipes was a hardship for many individuals. These products were something I took being able to buy for granted. However, I soon learned how many people did without these basic items.

The pantry serves men, women, and children who have fallen on hard times. 53 people came in August for these items. Over 100 family members were helped. We are growing in our outreach.

I'll never forget the look on an older gentleman's face when I gave him a bag. He was so shocked and had the biggest smile on his face when I told him he could have everything that was in the bag. He didn't have to do anything but come to the pantry. This is the reaction most people have when they come to the pantry. They constantly say thank you and God bless you.

Because our church is the only place in the community where these items are given out to those in need, your help is greatly needed to keep the pantry running. We need more volunteers who love to shop, pack bags, stock shelves, or help hand out bags. Also, financial help is needed. Thank you to all those who have already donated.
