Edith (Marion) Shoffner Vernon August 9, 1936 — July 17, 2025

Edith (Marion) Shoffner Vernon, 88, of Lynchburg, VA, died on July 17, 2025. She was born in Norristown, PA, on August 9, 1936, to Francis Lewis and Marion Boyd Shoffner. "Edie" grew up in Buena Vista, VA, graduating from Parry McClure High School in 1953. That year

she caught the eye of Joseph Henry Johnson "John" Vernon of Lexington, VA, while at McCrumbs Drugstore. Edie and John were married on March 17, 1957. Later that same year, she graduated as a Registered Nurse from the former Lewis-Gale Hospital School of Nursing in Roanoke, VA.

Her 62 years of marriage to John brought her many happy years of church and community involvement in Bullock Creek, SC, Winston-Salem, Charlotte and Belmont, NC, and Staunton, VA. Fond memories and friendships from each congregation remained important to Edith throughout her life. In 2003, John and Edith moved to the Summit Retirement Community in Lynchburg, VA, where family and both old and new friends enriched their final years. Home Goods Community Pantry Wednesday, August 20

Our Home Goods Community Pantry will be open on Wednesday, August 20. We served 114 households in July, and we continue to grow. Due to dramatic growth in popularity, financial and product donations are always welcomed and needed.

If you wish to donate items, there is a donation basket outside of the sanctuary for your convenience. Items needed include: Paper towels (2-pack), toilet paper (4-pack), tissues (small pack), trash bags (10 count), dish soap (one bottle), laundry detergent, and disinfectant wipes.

Appeal from the Treasurers

For a Treasurer, July is not only a time of green grass, picnics and family time, but as our church operates on a calendar budget, it marks the time when we are halfway (50%) through our giving year.

Session recently reviewed our halfway point and noticed that while our pledged giving is coming in as expected (47%), our unpledged giving has been lagging. In fact, "Other Income" (unpledged, loose plate and rent) is only 31% of our budget through June. As our rental income is contractually fixed and loose plate is very small, we need to look more closely at unpledged income.

With summer in full swing, there is also a seasonal lull in giving that can sometimes occur that puts more pressure on our finances. Our church expenses, however, don't take a summer vacation.

Please take this halfway point to reexamine your giving and consider an increase in your support and continue that support through the summer months...and beyond.

Our church has an enormous impact on our community, and our Building for Hope initiative plans to increase that collaboration with community programs and leaders. First Presbyterian has a long history of compassion and leadership. Let's show our support for these efforts. You can make a difference.
