Letter from the Pastor

Re-Interpreting "Mission Work" Today

A lot of us who have been raised in the church remember meeting missionaries on some special Sundays. Even though they were born and raised in the US, they typically spent most of their time overseas in some far-off country, far from Staunton, Virginia. From time to time, they might return to the US, where they might be invited by a congregation to teach a



Sunday School lesson, preach, or simply worship during their stay, as we would be the beneficiaries of wonderfully shared stories of faith.

These missionaries were sent out into the world to share the good news of Jesus Christ with those they encountered; oftentimes people who might have never heard of Jesus before.

And in turn, our understanding of mission work as American Christians was influenced in the same way. We understood mission to be programs, experiences, or events where we, as church members, were sent out into communities to share God's love through manual labor (service trips), educational programming (Vacation Bible School), or evangelism (outreach).

Instead of understanding our role as being sent out to far off places, I wonder what it looks like for us to participate in mission right here at church, and right here in Staunton.


Mission will always be about reaching out to share the love of Christ with the world. But it can also look different from time to time.

Due to dramatic growth in popularity, financial and product donations are always welcomed and needed. If you wish to donate items, there is a donation basket outside of the sanctuary for your convenience. Items needed include: Paper

towels (2-pack), toilet paper (4-pack), tissues (small pack), trash bags (10 count), dish soap (one bottle), laundry detergent, and disinfectant wipes.

I Go To The Beach, But I Don't Go in the Water

Growing up near the beach was a magical time. On a summer day, my parents, two sisters and I would pack the car with chairs, blankets, picnic supplies and an umbrella and drive the 30 minutes or so to Jones Beach on the south shore of Long Island. My sisters and I could hardly wait to arrive at the wide beach to jump out of the car, run to the water and jump in. We would stay in the water, enjoying the surf until we were finally called to come out, dry off and eat lunch. Then we anxiously had to wait one hour after eating, as was the custom, before racing down to the waves once more. The whole point of going to the beach was to jump in. I've noticed, as I have gotten older, that when I go to the beach now, it's not so much jumping in the water but relaxing on the beach and watching other people get wet. The purpose of the beach is more observational than jumping in.

As Christians, we are called to serve. Attending worship is essential to our faith, but it's not what we are being called to do. Serving can take many forms, from ushering, signing up for coffee time, serving as Lector, volunteering on church committees, performing "hands-on" mission (Home Goods Pantry, Trinity Lunch, etc.), and...providing leadership by serving on the Session. Maybe it's time to jump back into the water?
