*This article includes an excerpt from a sermon preached on 8/31/25. The *Westminster Dictionary of Theological Terms* defines *stewardship* as:

The responsibility given to humans in creation for managing the resources of the earth (Gen. 1:26). In the church, Christian stewardship involves the whole

of life since all life comes from God and is to be lived for God's glory (1 Cor. 4:1-2; 9:17; 1 Peter 4:10).

We are not being asked to think about stewardship only once a year as a check written to the church as part of some formula for religious piety.

No, stewardship is a daily decision to offer our whole selves to God's life-saving works in this world—every aspect of our being.

Stewardship, then, is about giving glory to God with each and every day that we are given on this earth.

Why?

Because at the end of the day, we understand that everything we have been given in this world is not of our own doing, but by God's grace and blessing.

The Impact of Stewardship

We are simply the caretakers of God's unlimited gifts given to us and this world.

- The time we spend, is it being spent helping to realize the kingdom among us today? This goes for everything, from how we spend our days at work and school, to who we choose to spend our hours with, to how we spend our free time. Are we using our time on this earth with intentionality, or passively waiting for the hours to tick by?

The **impact** of stewardship is likewise, of a kingdom perspective; an investment into the "already, not yet" realization of God's kingdom. Like the sacrifices that our spiritual ancestors made on our behalf generations previous to realize the church today, the time, talents, and treasures we invest in the year 2026 is not meant only for our own needs, but for the future calling of First Presbyterian years from now.



Stewardship Message: Building for Our Future

Dear Members and Friends of First Presbyterian,

It is my privilege to coordinate the fall stewardship campaign on behalf of the Session, in preparation for the 2026 budget year. In your recent October newsletter, I wrote a stewardship message stating that this year's theme would be *Building for Our Future*. This past year, we have heard a good deal about the *Building for Hope* program and our church's involvement in this exciting partnership that will help "congregations see the space they inhabit in their neighborhoods as sacred spaces that should be utilized for the best and highest good for the glory of God and the blessing of others."

You may recall a time when the Sanctuary was full on Sundays, but over the last 20 to 25 years, like many mainstream churches across America, our membership has declined, leaving us with large buildings that speak to the past and not to the future. There is no magic formula for building back the numbers First Presbyterian enjoyed up through the 1990s, but when Pastor Jeff and the Session re-imagined our church's Mission and Vision statement late last year, it opened our doors to new possibilities. *Building for Hope* addresses how we might "create a movement of sustained revitalization through community-based uses for our underutilized church facilities," allowing for greater connectedness to the Staunton community. *Building for Our Future* will allow us to realize the potential for use of our sacred spaces in ways we never imagined decades ago.

As we look ahead to 2026, our stewardship theme resonates with numerous ways we have already opened our doors and hearts to others. Think about the world-class music that fills our Sanctuary with groups like Heifetz, Staunton Music Festival, and Waynesboro Symphony Orchestra. Think about the community outreach we have with the Trinity Noon Lunch


