New Beginnings

Do not remember the former things or consider the things of old. I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth; do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert. (Isaiah 43:18-19)



With the hustle of the holiday season upon us, we sometimes forget that for us as Christians, the liturgical New Year begins with the first day of Advent (this year is November 30th).

The prophet Isaiah wrote these words of God for a people that were tired, burnt out, disheartened with their lives around them. From the Stewardship Committee

As we move forward into the Advent season and the weeks leading up to the birth of the Christ Child, our fall Stewardship Campaign, Building for Our Future will conclude. This does not mean that the opportunity to pledge your time, talent, and financial gifts have ended. There may be some of you who remain on the fence, hesitant about giving in a time of uncertainty. Uncertainty about a big sanctuary with empty pews; uncertainty because, for some of you, this isn't the way things used to be; uncertainty because the faces around us don't include the faces of children; and uncertainty because we live in a time where division and anger is tearing this country apart, along with many friendships and families.

Yet what better time to build into the future of First Presbyterian Church? The Stewardship Committee and Session have all heard the comments of those who say they haven't returned to church because there are so few here. The logic of that statement fails me completely. Or, I don't like coming here because none of my friends attend anymore. We may be small in numbers, but look at what we are doing to be that downtown historic church that is truly living into our Staunton community. Over the past weeks, members of the Stewardship Committee have talked about the ways we are fulfilling our mission to be an open and welcoming place through music, outreach, discipleship, and fellowship. New life has been breathed into building spaces that have been empty for years; we have an energetic Bible Study group that includes members of other churches; a Home Goods Pantry that in two years has grown so much that we now serve hundreds of people each month. First Pres just received an \$8,000 grant to support the Pantry's efforts to grow and serve those in need. Also, the opportunities for fellowship have grown to include members of our neighboring 2nd and 3rd Presbyterian Churches.

Anti-Racism Policy & Diversity Statement Approved by Session

- Commit to reviewing annually the congregation's own practices and implementing strategies to disrupt and dismantle systemic bias that presumes the primacy of white culture within our life together.
- Publicize resources to explore and understand the history of the congregations and communities within the Presbytery and the ways in which they have contributed to the history and systems of racism in our country.

Anti-Racism Policy & Diversity Statement Approved by Session At their November meeting, the Session voted to approve an anti-racism policy. As a congregation within the PC(USA), we are required to adopt such a policy as stated in The Book of Order (G-3.0106). Presbytery USA's stance on anti-racism and diversity is that racism is antithetical to its Christian mission and that definitive action is required to dismantle it. Affirmed by its General Assembly the PC(USA) has a churchwide anti-racism policy which holds that racism "is the opposite of what God intends for humanity. It is the rejection of the other, which is entirely contrary to the Word of God incarnate in Jesus Christ. Racism is a lie about our fellow human beings, for it states that some are less than others. Because of our biblical understanding of who God is and what God intends for humanity, the PC(USA) must stand against, speak against, and work against racism." Quote from "Facing Racism: A Vision of the Intercultural Community" (222nd General Assembly, 2016)

From the Book of Order: "The unity of believers in Christ is reflected in the rich diversity of the Church's membership.

In Christ, by the power of the Spirit, God unites persons through baptism regardless of race, ethnicity, age, sex, gender identity, sexual orientation, disability, geography, or theological conviction. There is therefore no place in the life of the Church for discrimination against any person."

The First Presbyterian Church of Staunton will:

- Seek to welcome and be open to all people in Christian community, regardless of age, race, orientation, identity, or political ideology, where all are united in Christ Jesus.
- Seek resources (curriculum, worship, preaching and music)
 which are reflective of all ethnic and racial backgrounds.
 Publicize anti-racism resources and yearly educational
 opportunities for members of the congregation to engage in
 as organized by the Presbytery.
