Through beautiful choruses and intricate scenes, the opera grapples with questions of how we live, how we die, how we fall apart, how we come together, and why we must keep singing to the very end.

The content and enduring message of this opera has inspired JMU to reach out to local congregations to invite them to attend one of their three performances, which will take place on the following dates:
